

EASTER FESTIVAL WHAT HAPPENED IN THE EARTH'S INTERIOR DURING THE RESURRECTION?

April 7, Saturday, 2:00 - 3:30 p.m.

As Sergei Prokofieff brings out in his book *The Mystery of the Resurrection in the Light of Anthroposophy* (English translation published by Temple Lodge in 2010), the Resurrection wrought momentous effects within the Earth's interior, effects which continue to the present time. Our Easter Festival will explore some of these effects, with the aid of pictures by Wilfried Ogilvie and Ninetta Sombart, music performed by Margaret Shipman and friends, and key passages in Prokofieff's book, particularly its third chapter, "The Resurrection and the Interior of the Earth". Special Easter refreshments will be served.

EXPLORING ANTHROPOSOPHICAL MEDICINE – INSIGHTS, CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES: A WEEKEND WITH ROSS RENTEA, M.D.

April 27, Friday, 8:00 - 9:30 p.m.

Lecture for members and friends. Dr. Rentea will introduce fundamental principles of Anthroposophical medicine and demonstrate new research results showing how anthroposophical medicine can become even more effective.

April 28, Saturday, 2:00 - 5:00 p.m.

Workshop for members and friends. We will go over specific anthroposophical medical and nutritional therapies and approaches to common conditions such as hardening of the arteries, blood sugar problems, memory and learning difficulties, and more. We also will work on ways to arrive at new and more insightful solutions to the day to day burdens of fatigue, nervousness, etc. Another element of the workshop will be the practical uses of True Botanica supplements and remedies. The entire session will be in workshop format with ample opportunity for questions and answers.

In addition to the lecture and workshop for members and friends, Dr. Rentea will guide a *workshop for professional therapists* from 10:00 a.m. to noon on the morning of Saturday, April 28. In this workshop he will offer novel therapeutic and nutritional protocols to condition specific issues and/or discuss therapy management problems. Special emphasis will be given to the work with boswellia, berberine, the seven metals, and other specifically anthroposophical medicines and substances. Besides his activity as a physician, he is an author, editor, and innovator.
